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COUNTY JAIL: A TYPICAL JURISDICTION'S LARGEST MENTAL HEALTH FACILITY

National Jail Admissions:	11 million people per year
Small and Mid-Sized County Jail Populations:	75% of national jail population
Detainees with serious mental illness:	2 million individuals
% of detainees with serious mental illness who also live with substance use disorders:	75%
Comparison of percent of people with serious mental illness in county jails vs general population:	6x greater in county jails vs. general population
Impact of detainment on outcomes for people with mental illness or substance use disorders:	longer stays in jail, higher recidivism rates



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
ENTER: NACO, SAMHSA, AND SEQUENTIAL INTERCEPT MAPPING

A road map for leveling silos and raising outcomes.

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INTERCEPT:

Times in a person's life at which resources might minimize the negative effects of any involvement in the court system.

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SEQUENTIAL INTERCEPT MAPPING (SIM):

The Sequential Intercept Model (SIM) details how individuals with mental and substance use disorders come into contact with and move through the criminal justice system.

- Helps communities identify resources and gaps in services at each intercept and develop local strategic action plans.
- Brings together leaders and different agencies and systems to work together to identify strategies to divert people with mental and substance use disorders away from the justice system into treatment.
